# NEW-PEN-DEL MEET THE BOARD Pat and the Matthews Family



My love for dogs goes way back to 1st grade. Spot, the dog in the *Dick and Jane* beginner







readers series, was the dog I dreamt of and begged my parents for. That Christmas I received my very own

Spot, a black and white Spaniel mix. Spot was the family pet who lived and was loved for 16 years. In the early 80's, on a visit to Alaska, I fell for big dogs. My sister-in-law lives in Alaska and had a Newfie mix called Rusty. He was a friendly goofy

dog, and I knew that was the type of dog for me. My husband, Ed, needed to be convinced though. Ed was not really a dog lover. His experience with dogs had been that of the family dog of his youth, a hound mix who frequently escaped from their backyard terrorizing the neighbor kids on their way to school stealing and eating their lunches. Ed was always sent out to retrieve the dog and bring him back home. It took me nearly sixteen years to convince him. In 2001, I finally did, although reluctantly! My niece-in- law and nephew knew that I was looking. They said, "Aunty Patty, you have got to look in larger newspapers than *The Home News!*" On their advice I started looking in *The Star Ledger*. (LOL!) One day, I came across an ad for a New Finland Dog. I had never heard of that breed. After repeating the name a few times, I realized it was probably a typo and called. Yes, in fact it was a misspelling. This family had a Newfoundland and wanted another, so they bred her. Princess had ten pups and I was getting second pick! I chose Molly, my first Newf. Ed soon fell in love with her when he realized she was a chick magnet. Wherever we brought her, people crowded around wanting to pet her. Molly was a natural born swimmer. She was always drawn to water, first playing in her water dish, then dragging us to the canal to swim. She would jump off the dock and swim for hours at our friend's house at Budd Lake. She left us way too soon at the age of eight.

Maggie Rose was our second Newf. With Maggie we were introduced to NPD Newfoundland Club and the world of water and draft training. However, we found out that we weren't the best trainers and Maggie wasn't as enthusiastic as Molly had been about swimming and jumping off docks. She did take to drafting and participated in several tree pulls in Sussex County and NY. She was infamous for using the communal water bowl as her personal foot bath! She would put her big, hot, tired paws in to cool them off. We eventually wised up and brought her very own foot bath so

she wouldn't pollute everyone's water bowl. Maggie was a kind, gentle soul, who everyone enjoyed! Maggie became a therapy dog at the age of one. For eight years she brought joy to the children at South Brunswick Library's reading program, and South Brunswick elementary school. She also was a volunteer at Princeton House. The patients there just loved her. COVID brought an end to that though. We were both heartbroken when she passed at the age of ten.

Pearl is our present Newf. She is an exuberant fun loving 1 year old Landseer. When she turned 6 months she became a mouthy excited devil-dog that Ed nicknamed Oyster's Irritation. She is a smart pup who will take us on new adventures and teach us many things. The first being that patience is a virtue and virtue is a grace. When you put them both together you get a happy face and pup!

All but 2 of the 15 dogs in his life were adopted. He currently has a 10-yearold golden retriever certified therapy dog and a new addition, a 10-month-old newfoundland mix named Maxwell Smart. He believes that people never "own" dogs but that the dogs are part of the household to be respected and cared for, never neglected, and abandoned on a chain outdoors. basic health and genetic precautions, causing many ill health issues, premature death, behavior issues, and unwanted, abandoned dogs. The dogs bred irresponsibly pay the price, and often that is an untimely demise or unhealthy life.

They took him out to introduce us, holding him by the collar. Took him out to go the bathroom, still holding his collar. Told us he barks a lot, especially when their 3yr old gets on top of the crate. Never seen a house with a Newf without hair/fur. We believed Bear spent most of the day in the crate. When they got him, he was a cute little 8-week-old black ball of fur. They didn't know in a few short months He was going to be 125 lbs. They made the right decision contacting NPD. They





#### **General Guidelines**

- 1. Each member-owned Newfoundland completing the requirements for a Breed Championship, CH, GCH, all AKC obedience titles, ThD, DD, DDX, TDD, WD, WRD and/or WRDX will receive an award. Owner is responsible for sending copies of all certificates of titles achieved with this form.
- 2. In case of multiple titles for the same dog, one award will be given per year.
- 3. The awards year for all AKC titles and/or NCA titles, will be based on the calendar year January through December.
- 4. Additional awards for breeder and/or co-owner may be purchased by the owner of a dog receiving an award at the club's cost. Please contact Donna Campbell or Karin Bystol directly for such requests.
- 5. To qualify for an award/certificate, the owner of the dog must be a member or have applied for membership as of January 1st of the year for which the award is given. Dogs owned or co-owned by New-Pen-Del members are eligible for awards/certificates only if the dog permanently resides with the New-Pen-Del member.
- 6. A photocopy of CGC, recognized therapy dog registration must be attached to the awards form.





# **HELP SAVE A NEWFOUNDLAND** FROM CRUCIATE DISEASE!



This fundraiser is organized by Newfoundland Club of America Charitable Trust.

The canine cranial cruciate ligament is much like a human's anterior cruciate ligament (ACL), acting as an important stabilizer of the knee joint in both species. Although any dog can rupture the ligament, it is uncommon to happen through injury alone. Rather, genetics play an



essential role in the degeneration of the cruciate ligament, increasing the risk of a rupture.

"In dogs, ligament degeneration and progressive rupture of collagen fibers in the ligament tissue leads to the development of knee joint instability over time," says Peter Muir, laboratory codirector and a professor in the Department of Surgical Sciences in the UW School of Veterinary Medicine. Both genetic and environmental factors, such as physical health, body condition and neutering, contribute to chronic ligament degeneration.

Pinpointing whether a dog is more likely to rupture a cruciate ligament due to genetics allows the dog's owner and veterinarian to take preventative measures, such as keeping the dog physically healthy and monitoring for signs of emerging injury. It can also help avoid the expenses and recovery involved in a rupture.

Rupturing a cruciate ligament, either partially or entirely, is a lengthy, expensive process for dogs and their people. Surgical treatment can cost between \$4,000-\$7,000 per knee in a dog. And once a rupture happens in one knee, there's a 50 percent chance the other will tear as well.

The NCA Charitable Trust is funding a study to confirm a DNA Test for Cruciate Ligament Rupture risk in Newfoundland Dogs, expanding the current test that is available for Labrador Retrievers. Please help us by donating today - https://gofund.me/056c9740

Nancy takes them in from the NPD region and has them vetted immediately which runs to \$600 per dog. She contacts the applicants and does house inspections either by zoom or in person. Nancy needs help transporting as well as doing home inspections. She gets a lot of dogs in Pa and from puppy mills in NY. They are dumping their dogs.

Nancy needs help talking to people in the area who are interested in adopting as well as giving up their dogs. Nancy needs to be a part of this as she is the liaison with Cathy Durant.

People on the committee would be taking the applications and vetting them before passing them on to Nancy Weaver. The dogs need to go to Nancy where they can be in a kennel before they are introduced to others.



Karin will email a summary of the conversation to everyone who has volunteered. Karin would divide up the responsibilities based on geographic location.

Eg: Colonial's Mall walk, New England's Mystic Seaport Day, Bear Mountain's walk across the Hudson, Northland's Schenectady Holiday Parade, etc.

To increase member ownership - create a New Member "Welcome package" - distribute to all initially, then new members only.

Welcome packet will start with a mission statement by defining our purpose as a Regional Club of the NCA. Include explanation of members being stewards of the breed, identify what breed standards are as well as a history of both the breed and Club. Include a brief discussion of our responsibility in breed preservation - how our dogs are indeed living history and that we are caretakers for the next generation. We are indeed keepers of the standard, fanciers and protectors of the breed.

Reinforce that we are also a social club that relies on its membership for volunteers, growth and financial solvency.

Encourage/expand member initiative to host informal group activities.

On a Board level we must improve accountability with shared responsibility Implement event budgeting and planning. Report on actual profit and loss for events as compared to budget.

Design simple budget templates for users to complete in advance of events. Design new, universal event profit/loss statements to maintain consistency By-Laws and job descriptions need updating and modernizing with automatic revision deadlines in place.

Ways & Means requires re-organization. It is unsustainable in its present form. Other Clubs have done away with this position.

### **New Business**

Ana organized a small walk at Sandy Hook. There were 15 dogs taking a mile walk on a nice day. She recommends doing more of these events. It can be any number of people and very low key. Ana would like to open it up to club members. We don't need a certificate of insurance. We can call it a NPD event. Chris suggested joining a dog friendly parade. Ana can put the information out on our sites. It could also help recruit volunteers.
