



Go to the App store on your iPhone or Android device and download the Wild Apricot for Members app.










Between working events, show ring, obedience, handling class and Paws in Hand and having puppies our four furry children keep us quite busy.

Currently, I am the treasurer of the New Pen Del Newfoundland Club. I serve on the Newfoundland Ambassador committee for the Newfoundland Club of America.


The Newf temperament is the hallmark of the breed and coupled with healthy dogs that is what really matters. My wife Ellen and I have raised 2 daughters

& the Lynn Family



Come and enjoy a fun-filled day in the water with your Newf(s) and your good friends. THE TRAINING AREA AT Round Valley Reservoir, in Lebanon, NJ will be the same as last year. THE ACCESS TO THE WATER IS MORE GRADUAL AND THE SWIMMING AREA IS LESS ROCKY, BUT THERE IS NO SHADE, SO PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY FOR THE COMFORT OF YOU AND YOUR DOG. There is no on site source of drinking water, other than the lake. There is water and a real restroom facility a bit of a drive down the road and a porta potty near our site. The reservoir has lots of water access so there will be lots of water time throughout the morning and afternoon sessions. We will have several stations where handlers can learn how to teach their dogs various water exercises, both in and out of the water. As always, a team of qualified instructors will be on hand to assist with the training of dogs and owners. In the afternoon, we will be awarding "Guppy, Tadpole, or Frog Certificates" for beginner Newfs who take to the water and achieve each level. These are simple tests that require little or no advance training. The park also has lots of trails in the woods for everyone to enjoy- there are some playground areas down the road as well- come have fun!

We are continuing the tradition of offering everyone the opportunity to enjoy the fun with their dogs (the paws), while finishing the day with a lobster tail (the claws) and/or steak feast. This is a day worth the trip no matter which activity you prefer!! All those interested in participating are welcome to attend. We guarantee a fun time to all, whether you are training a dog, just want to enjoy a fun day with your Newfies, or are looking for good company and a great dinner. 



WATER TRAINING SEASON IS COMING...

Home Training Tips



Water training season is fast approaching and there is a lot of foundation training that can be done at home and on dry land in cold weather and even on rainy days to get ready.

The following fun training exercises can be done with dogs of all ages, from puppies to seniors. Even if you never plan to take the Newfoundland Club of America (NCA) Water Test, training your dog can help you bond with your dog and engage your working dog. Further, the more you train on land, the more confidence you and your dog will have when you finally get in the water. Successful training teams build bonds through daily training, building trust and confidence together. The following exercises are part of the NCA Water Dog

Following are some on land training tips for the Junior Division Exercises:

Basic Control - Shows that the handler has control over the dog. The exercises are performed off leash in the waterfront test area within 35 feet of the water's edge. There are two parts, controlled walking and a recall. Controlled walking just means the dog walks within four (4') of the handler for a distance of approximately 60 feet.

TRAINING TIPS

Controlled Walking – Put your dog on a 2' leash (usually on your left side) and encourage the dog to walk next to you by holding out a treat in front of him and telling the dog to stay close or heel. Start training by walking in your house or yard, without other people or distractions around. Praise your dog for staying close and not pulling on the leash. Go for short distances and give a treat, slowly increasing the distance, moving the treats from your hand to your pocket, then

removing the treat altogether. Remember to verbally praise the dog when it does what you asked. To be effective, the reward must immediately follow the action. Eventually, move to places with distractions, either a park or a pet store are great places to practice. Even strip malls can provide enough distractions to confirm the dog understands the exercise, always keeping the dog on leash.

Recall - Recalls are lots of fun for dogs and can be used for a variety of circumstances, including keeping the dog safe if they're in an unsafe situation and you need to call them back. Recalls can be taught by asking your dog to sit and stay, then walking approximately 5 feet from the dog and luring them to you with a treat and calling "front" or "come." Slowly increase the distance until you can call the dog from 30 feet away, giving a treat and praising the dog when it does what you asked. Recalls can be trained on leash as well. If your dog is not holding their sit-stay, put your dog on a leash and ask a friend to hold the leash, preventing the dog from moving, before you call "front." Eventually, move to spaces with more distractions, hold the dog's leash, move to the end of the 6' leash and call the dog. Ideally, you want the dog to come and sit in front of you (without bumping you).

Both these exercises need to be trained away from the water before you try them near the water. *Never take your dog off leash in un-fenced areas.*

Single Retrieve – The handler will throw the bumper at least thirty (30) feet out from shore and into swimming depth water for the dog. The dog swims out to the bumper, retrieves it, and brings it to the handler on the shore. The dog must deliver the bumper to hand.


TRAINING TIPS

A solid take, hold, and give is the cornerstone of most water rescue exercises. It is critical that these commands are taught separately and on land, before attempting the exercises in the water. You can teach these while sitting on your couch to dogs of all ages. Be patient. If you're consistent, the dog will learn the commands.

Take is taught by putting a bumper, rope, toy, etc. near the dog's mouth. If the dog touches the item, give them a treat. Once the dog catches on, wait for the dog to open its mouth and allow for the item to be placed inside, praise and give a treat, eventually letting go of the item and as soon as the dog holds it, praise and give a treat. The exercise progresses by putting items down, at different distances and directing the dog to take the item. Again, praise and treat, changing the items, locations, and distractions before moving on to teach hold. Dogs get very excited to take things they're normally not allowed to touch. Drop a sock? Ask the dog to take it! Bringing in the mail? Ask the dog to take the junk mail in for you!

All these exercises will help reinforce the take command in a fun way. Once, you have a solid take, move on to hold.

Hold is taught by putting a bumper, rope, toy, etc. in the dog's mouth or asking the dog to take



the item. If the dog holds the item for even 2 seconds, praise the dog with "good hold." Next, try extending the hold by having the dog take the item and tap the side of the item to try to release it from the dog's mouth. There's no need to be rough, just tap hard enough such that if the dog is not grasping with its teeth, it will fall out. If the dog grabs on, say "good hold" and give a treat. If the dog releases the item when you tap it, place it back in the dog's mouth, say hold and wait a little longer, praising the dog for holding, before trying to tap the item out again. Once the dog understands the exercise, you can use two hands to try to gently pull the toy out of its mouth, again praising if the dog grabs on. Inevitably, dogs will drop items. The trick is to praise before they drop the item, so that the dog understands that when you say hold, you want the dog to have the item in their mouth. Try items of different materials and textures as eventually, they'll need to hold canvas and plastic bumpers, ropes, life jackets and boat cushions.

Give is taught by anticipating when the dog might drop the items, saying "give" and taking the item from the dog's mouth. If the dog drops the item, before placing it in your hand, ask the

dog to take the item again, say hold and finally direct them to "give." Don't rush this lesson. Start by expecting your dog to hold for a few seconds, anticipate the drop and again, say give, gently taking the item from the dog's mouth. Do not pull the item from the dog's mouth, like you're playing tug. Wait for the dog to release the item on to your hand, praise and give a treat. These are commands you'll need to reinforce over and over, by varying items, locations and distractions. Once you are confident the dog knows the commands, bring a friend to practice taking items from your dog to get the dog used to going to strangers, as well.

Drop Retrieve – A life jacket or boat cushion is dropped from a canoe or kayak approximately 50 feet from shore. The judges will select the article the dog will retrieve, the morning of the test. The dog must retrieve the article and return to the handler's hand.

TRAINING TIPS

Cushions and life jackets are sometimes awkward items for dogs to take and carry. It is important, that while practicing take, hold and give, handlers introduce these items as well. Train the drop retrieve on land, by asking your dog to sit next to you and telling them to stay. Place the life jacket or cushion a few feet away from you, return to your dog, and direct the dog to take the item. Repeat the take, hold and give commands by sending the dog to the boat cushion and jacket from different distances and directions.

Take a Line – The handler puts a knotted rope with a trailing line in the dog's mouth. A steward will swim out 50 feet and call the dog by its name.

The dog must swim out to the steward close enough for the steward to reach the line without changing his/her location in the water. The dog must hold the line in its mouth until the steward can grasp it, but the dog does not have to relinquish the line to the steward.

TRAINING TIPS

Take a line is perhaps the most difficult exercise for dogs to learn, since it's not as instinctual for a dog to take something out as it is to retrieve items. *Again, take, hold and give will be key in achieving success.* To effectively train this exercise, it is best to ask a friend or training partner for assistance. Ask a family member or friend to stand a few feet away from you and the

dog. Gently place the knotted end of the line in the dog's mouth and ask the dog to take and hold the line.

Have your training partner, call the dog's name, asking the dog

to come to them or help them.

If the dog is hesitant to go to a stranger, start with encouraging the dog to go to a stranger without the line. Simply ask your training partner to call the dog, have the person praise and give the dog a treat when it reaches them. You may need to repeat this a few times with various "strangers" before re-introducing the line. Once the dog feels comfortable going to strangers, re-start training the exercise with the line. *Training is a process*. Viewing your dog as part of your team and having patience as you both navigate your strengths and weaknesses will lead to your success.

Tow A Boat – A steward in a boat, 50 feet from shore will call the dog. The steward will hold the dog's canvas bumper with line attached and splash the bumper close to the boat. The dog

should swim to the boat, take the bumper or line from the calling steward, and tow the boat to shore. The dog must pull the boat until it touches the bottom.

TRAINING TIPS

It is beneficial to have a training partner, while training this exercise as well. On land, tie an empty gallon of water to the line with the canvas bumper. Have the dog sit next to you and tell the dog to stay. Meanwhile, ask a training partner to hold the line and call the dog from a few feet away. Give your dog the command to take it, and point toward your training partner. Once the dog arrives at your training partner, they should place the bumper in the dog's mouth. Ask your dog to hold as it's returning the bumper to you, while dragging the gallon of water.

Remember to praise and give your dog a treat when it returns the bumper to you. Slowly add water to the gallon, to add weight. This will get the dog used to pulling heavier items, making noise or dragging behind them. If you add water and the dog stops pulling, back off and remove some water to reduce the weight. Some dogs don't hesitate and will pull a half a gallon of water the first time, while others need a slower transition. Be patient as to not turn the dog off to the exercise.

Swim with Handler – The dog and handler will swim together for 20 feet. The prescribed distance is not judged until both the handler and the dog have begun swimming. The dog may swim in any position within a 4-foot radius of the handler. The dog may not swim on top of the handler nor otherwise impede the handler from reaching the prescribed distance.

TRAINING TIPS

Teaching the dog basic control, using the stay close or heel command will also help when swimming with handler. In the water, you can splash next to you to keep the dog an arm's length away. Practice walking with your dog and holding your arm out while holding a treat, to train the exercise on land.

So you and your dog have learned to pull a cart, and maybe have entered into draft tests, you have participated in the Christmas tree pull, but would like to do something more... You may have looked at video of the "Amazing 8" and thought why can't NPD put together a multi dog hitch for parades and demonstrations? Well, now we can! If your dog has done draft work and you would like to be part of a draft team, we now have the equipment to do so, safely.

Years ago, I had the buggy (pictured below) built for my big Lab. Now he is too old to do draft and my girls are too small to pull it alone, so I had new shafts made for a team. I also had center poles made to attach for up to three more teams, and one more dog can be hitched to the end of the pole, making possible to have a 9dog hitch. The same poles could be attached to the wagon we used for the tree pull, with a maximum of 3 teams and one in front. Or mix and match, 2 teams on the buggy and 2 teams on the wagon. I was planning on using the wagon for practices with the Dog teams before hitching to my custom built buggy. The dogs will be hitched a little differently than when carting. Breeching straps will be required and we will be using front holdbacks. (Ever wonder what the ring on the chest of the harness is used for?). Dogs will be attached in front, on the side by the pole, and in the rear to the tree. This is very similar to the way Budweiser harnesses their Clydesdales. the dogs total control of the vehicle This gives them safe. WilczekWoodworks.com has some good examples on their website of a 6 & 7 dog hitch.

In early December there is an all animal parade near Bethlehem, PA. Wouldn't it be fun to do a 6, 8 or even 9 dog hitch for this Christmas parade? What about a multi hitch demo at the next draft test. Or to show off the big beautiful dogs working together at one of the "cluster dog shows". If the nationals ever come back east, a nice show of the NPD Draft Team would attract lots of attention for our club. There are Halloween parades,

Easter parades, and many other opportunities to show off our talented dogs and watch the reactions of spectators as they see a multi dog hitch. A draft team would build interest in Newfoundland breed and the club.

If anyone is interested, please get back to me. Unfortunately, with this Covid lockdown, this probably won't start until the weather cools down in the fall. Hopefully this gives you good reason to get out and practice draft with your dogs.
