



- Highest scoring member-owned Newfoundland in Novice B.
- Highest scoring member-owned Newfoundland in Beginner Open.
- · Highest scoring member-owned Newfoundland in Open A.
- · Highest scoring member-owned Newfoundland in Open B.
- · Highest scoring member-owned Newfoundland in Utility A.
- 2. The following will receive an award:
- · Highest member-owned Newfoundland combined score in Open B and Utility B.
- Highest scoring member-owned Newfoundland (in regular class).
- Perfect Score Award—presented to each member-owned Newfoundland scoring 200 points in a regular class at an AKC show.

• OTCH Award—presented to each member-owned Newfoundland earning an Obedience Trial Championship.

Section 2: Working

The following will receive an award:

- Top member-owned Sire in Working.
- Top member-owned Dam in Working.
- Top member Breeder in Working.

Section 3: Conformation

The following will receive an award:

- Top member-owned Sire in Conformation (minimum of 5 championships).
- Top member-owned Dam in Conformation (minimum of 3 championships).
- Top member Breeder in Conformation.
- Top Show Dog (male who defeats the most Newfoundlands).
- Top Show Bitch (female who defeats the most Newfoundlands).
- Register of Merit—presented to each member-owned Newfoundland designated as ROM by the Newfoundland Club of America

• Junior Showmanship Award—presented to the Junior Handler (family or individual member) who defeats the greatest number of dogs in Junior Showmanship competition at AKC point shows.

• Best in Show Award—presented to each member-owned Newfoundland that is awarded Best in Show at an all-breed AKC show

• Top Owner Handler Newfoundland Owner Handler who defeats the most dogs.

Section 4: Versatility

The Versatility Award will be presented to each member-owned Newfoundland designated as a Versatile Newfoundland by the Newfoundland Club of America.

Section 5: Working Achievements

The Working Achievement Award will be presented to each member-owned Newfoundland designated as receiving a working achievement title by the Newfoundland Club of America.

Section 6: Non-Competitive Certificates

The Living Legend Award will be presented to each member-owned Newfoundland following the date the Newfoundland reaches the age of ten (10) years. Certificates will be awarded for Newfoundlands earning AKC Canine Good Citizenship (CGC) or a recognized therapy dog certification.

Section 6: General

1. Each member-owned Newfoundland completing the requirements for a Breed Championship, CH, GCh, all AKC obedience titles, ThD, DD, DDX, TDD, WD, WRD and/or WRDX will receive an award. Owner is responsible for sending copies of all certificates of titles achieved with this form.

2. In case of multiple titles for the same dog, one award will be given per year.

3. The awards year for all AKC titles and/or NCA titles, will be based on the calendar year January through December.

4. Additional awards for breeder and/or co-owner may be purchased by the owner of a dog receiving an award at the club's cost. Please contact Donna Campbell or Karin Bystol directly for such requests.

5. To qualify for an award/certificate, the owner of the dog must be a member or have applied for membership as of January 1st of the year for which the award is given. Dogs owned or co-owned by New-Pen-Del members are eligible for awards/certificates only if the dog permanently resides with the New-Pen-Del member.

6. A photocopy of CGC, recognized therapy dog registration must be attached to form.



Please review the guidelines to determine whether your Newfoundland(s) are eligible for an award/certificate.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE NEW PEN DEL BOARD OF DIRECTORS HAS REVISED THE POLICY TO STATE THAT ALL AWARDS ARE BASED UPON THE CALENDAR YEAR JANUARY1 - DECEMBER 31, 2021.

Starting with Fundamentals of Draft Work on Saturday morning, followed by three levels of hands on draft work, Advanced, Intermediate and Beginner, on Saturday afternoon and all day Sunday, this workshop is intended **for both beginning and experienced draft dogs and handlers and everything in between!** No experience is necessary to participate in the workshop. Beginners are also welcome to come on Sunday to continue to learn and can continue to work with their dogs, and /or watch or help steward.

All three of the instructors are approved Newfoundland Club of America Draft Test judges, have earned multiple individual and team draft titles, and have led draft work seminars together and individually for many working breeds. Each has over 20 years draft experience.

Northern New Jersey:

Go west on I-78 to exit 54A US 222 South. Follow 222 South to PA 272 Adamstown/Knauers exit. Turn right onto PA 272 South. Go 2.3 miles to second traffic light. Turn left onto Route 897. Continue on Route 897S for 4.7miles (straight thru 1 stop sign in Fivepointville, continue past Weavers Dry Goods (on your right). Immediately past Goods Feed Mill (on your right) make a left onto Long Lane. Entrance to Park ahead on the left.

Central New Jersey:

Take the New Jersey Turnpike to the PA Turnpike. Go west on the PA turnpike to the Lancaster/Reading exit 286. Go .8 miles on Spur Road. Turn right onto North Reading Road / PA 272. Keep Up With Your Dog's Training Through the Winter

Brrr, it's cold outside! But that doesn't mean all of the great training momentum you and your pup have built up over the past months has to come to a screeching halt.

Even though it's winter, your dog still needs the physical and mental stimulation that come from learning new skills. Here are some ideas for keeping up with training and exercise when there is snow and ice outside.

1. Teach a skill indoors

Choose a <u>Canine Good Citizen</u> (CGC) skill your dog doesn't have (or needs to polish) and set up a daily training time indoors. You can work on "sit", "down", "come" and "stay," in a small space. If you are ready to move beyond CGC, start to teach your dog to heel. You can move furniture, such

as small tables or chairs, so that you have obstacles that can be used to refine your pup's heeling skills.

2. Tease their brains

One of the most exciting new training activities is <u>AKC Trick Dog</u>, and tricks at all levels can be easily taught indoors. Novice tricks include behaviors such as barking on cue, crawling, get in a box, jump through a hoop or over a low bar, kiss my cheek, and shake hands. <u>Training videos</u> will help you get started. Tricks training will provide fun and mental puzzles for your dog, and you and your pup will enjoy this positive, happy activity.

3. Provide indoor exercise

Canine freestyle moves (doggy dancing) are a good way to exercise larger dogs indoors. And, there is a certain amount of exercise your dog can get when you do CGC exercises as speed drills, sit, down, come, run with me (in a small area), stop, down, let's go . . . " You get the idea.

People go to gyms when the weather is nasty. Consider enrolling your dog in an indoor training class during the winter. Nothing will chase those winter blues away faster than earning your dog's <u>Canine Good Citizen</u> or <u>AKC Community Canine</u> title.

4. Get outdoor exercise

Even when it's winter, there are breaks in the weather. Put on your coat and go outside with your dog for a brisk exercise walk. In city settings, where sidewalks are clear, you can practice the <u>AKC</u> <u>Urban CGC skills</u>. For outdoor exercise and training, if sidewalks are salted, you may want to put boots on your dog, but when it comes to training, don't let winter stand in your way.

PET HEALTH FEBRUARY IS DENTAL HEALTH MONTH!

DENTAL HOME CARE FOR YOUR DOG

Brushing your pet's teeth daily, or at least 3 times per week, is essential in maintaining proper dental health.

1. Select an appropriate time

Find a quiet, convenient time when you and your dog are both relaxed.

2. Acquaint your dog with the process

For the first few sessions, don't use a toothbrush. Hold your dog as if you are cuddling and gently stroke the outside of his/her cheeks with your finger. After your pet is comfortable with that, try rubbing your finger along the gums. Next, place a dab of toothpaste on your finger and let him/her taste it. We suggest C.E.T, which is especially made for pets. Do not use human toothpaste.

3. Introduce the toothbrush

Place a small amount of toothpaste on the first three rows of the toothbrush. We suggest a small, softbristled brush. In a slow back and forth motion, brush one or two teeth and the gum line. This gets your dog accustomed to the feel of the brush. Replace your pet's toothbrush on a regular basis, ideally once a month.

4. Begin brushing

Over the next several days, gradually increase the number of teeth brushed. It is important to eventually brush the rear teeth where plaque and tartar have a

greater tendency to accumulate. Slowly and gently pull open the cheek with your fingers to reach the back areas. Stop brushing before your dog begins to fuss. If he/she learns to dislike the procedure and figures out that fussing makes you stop more quickly, then brushing is going to get harder rather than easier. Gradually build up to about 30 seconds per side. Concentrate only on the outside surfaces of the teeth (towards the cheek). Dogs accumulate very little tartar on the insides.

5. Make brushing a pleasurable experience

Proceed slowly and gently. Stop each session while it is still fun and lavishly praise your dog afterwards with petting and treats. Patience, dedication, and snacks may be necessary! For optimum oral hygiene, brush your dog's teeth every day. Daily brushing will also make you feel better the next time your dog klsses you! 6 Consult your veterinarian For guidance on brushing, or for a customized home-care program best suited to you and your pet, speak with your veterinarian.

Doggy Dental Facts

 Puppies have 28 temporary teeth that emerge at about three to four weeks of age. They have 42 permanent teeth that begin to surface at about four months of age.

Winter |

- Puppies should lose their baby teeth before the corresponding adult teeth emerge. If a puppy tooth is still in place when an adult tooth begins to show, see your veterinarian to prevent a problem with your dog's bite.
- Signs of a dental problem can include bad breath, yellow-brown crust on teeth, bleeding from the gums, difficulty eating, abnormal drooling, dropping food from the mouth, swallowing food without chewing, losing teeth, pain when the mouth is manipulated, and bad breath. Dogs are not supposed to have dog breath!
- Small dog breeds and dogs that have beards are more likely to develop periodontal disease than large dogs because the teeth of small dogs are often too large for their mouths.
- The canine teeth of working dogs are essential to allowing the dogs to carry prey and other objects. If these teeth become broken, a veterinary dentist can perform endodontic procedures, such as root canals and metal crown preparation. Procedures are available to treat many teeth that previously would have been extracted.
- A broken tooth is a common problem especially among outdoor dogs. Aggressive chewing on hard objects such as bones and cow hooves is the primary cause.

Please schedule regular dental checkups and cleanings with your veterinarian. They are vital to your pet's overall health.




